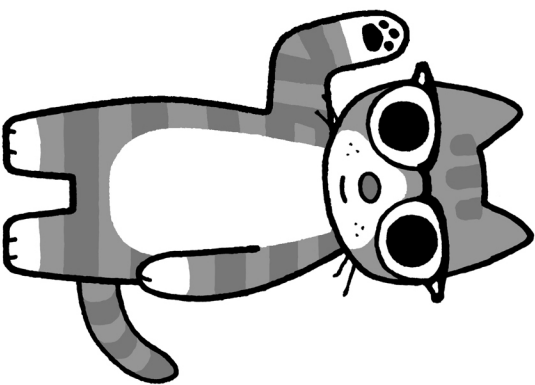

If you do well in your studies, in just a few years you may be able to have MORE - more status, more money, more pleasure, more security.

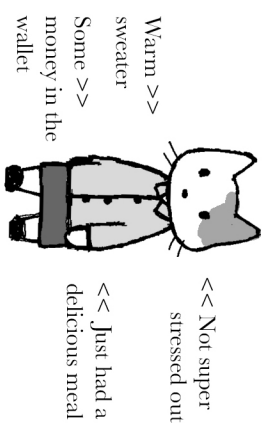


Figure 1. The Temptations are both real & imagined.

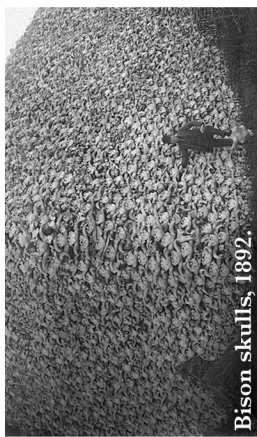
